## Trial set in shooting plot

A juvenile court judge Thursday set a trial date for a group of teenagers in an alleged shooting plot at C.K. McClatchy High School.

Judge Jane Ure ordered three of the four youths to stand trial June 14. The fourth is expected to be added to the trial today.

The group includes a 14-year-old girl and three boys, ages 13, 14 and 15.

The Bee is not naming them because they are juveniles.

All are accused of plotting to shoot two girls who beat up the 14-year-old girl at school.

The 15-year-old boy was arrested April 26 at a Freeport Boulevard light-rail station carrying a handgun and extra ammunition, police said. The 14-year-old boy, also arrested at the light-rail station, allegedly had photos of the intended victims. The 13-year-old boy is accused of supplying the gun.

All are charged with conspiracy to commit assault with a deadly weapon. The 15-year-old and 13-year-old boys also face weapons-possession charges. Prosecutors recently added gang-enhancement charges against all four.

Two are McClatchy students. The others attend area schools. All four remain in custody.
